## Local Colored Club Swept Off Its Feet by Chicagoans' Whirlwind Playing.

Playing gamely but hopelessly against the American Giants, of Chicago, colored champions of the world, the Fort Wayne Colored Giants were beaten at League park Friday afternoon 14 to 3, in a game replete with whirlwind plays, hard hitting, fast base running and spectacular fielding on the part of the Chicagoans.

The visitors knocked the ball to all parts of the field, netting a total of eighteen safeties, two of which were triples by Torrenti, and three doubles, one each by Williams, Grant, and DeMoss. The home club was unable to gather more than three hits off as many pitchers, and the locals' scores were due to the generosity of the visitors whose fatal overthrow to catch a runner napping allowed the tallies.

Though far too one-sided to furnish much interest in the way of competition the brand of baseball was a treat to fans, and held their interest throughout the nine innings.
