Eight cities are represented, as follows: New Orleans, Birmingham, Atlanta, Nashville, Montgomery, Knoxville, Pensacola and Jacksonville, Fla. Games will be played every Saturday and Sunday.

The Caulfield Ads which will represent New Orleans in the league, play a series with the Indianapolis negro team Saturday, Sunday and Monday at Heinemann Park.
