Detroit Stars defeated the Chicago Giants the second time in two days, Sunday, 9 to 4.

The game was exciting from start to finish. Ball, Chicago hurler, was batted from the box in the first inning. McDougall, who relieved him, held the heavy-hitting Detroiters from scoring again until the sixth inning. "Mac" weakened at this juncture. His support also faltered, the Stars scoring five times. "Jimmy" Lyons injected a timely hit that emptied the sacks. The Giants bunched all but one of their hits in the second inning, scoring four runs. McDougall drove out a home run.
