

COLORED TEAMS AT NAVIN FIELD

American Giants and Detroit Stars Clash Again on Sunday.

There are not many ball clubs outside of the major leagues who travel in their special cars and then only during the world's series or on special occasions, but Rube Foster's American Giants, who are engaging the Detroit Stars in a championship series here, have their own private car, chef and all the other accommodations that go with them.

These clubs are ranked at the top of the semi-professional field and the six-game series here, the second of which will be decided at Navin field Sunday afternoon, should be one of the best ever

staged here. It is a battle for the league lead, which now is held by the American Giants, with the Detroit Stars the nearest challengers.

The Labor Day game also will be played at Navin field, after which the clubs will move over to Mack park for three games. Sunday's game will be called at 3 o'clock.
