

ALL PROS TAKE CLOSE CON- TEST FROM A. B. C.'s

ANDERSON, Ind., Oct. 9.—Jack Hendrick's Indianapolis all-professionals defeated the Taylor A. B. C.'s, 5 to 4, in a fast exhibition game here this afternoon.

A feature was a home run over the right field fence by "Pug" Cavet, in the fourth which scored three runs. Charleston of the A. B. C.'s lined out a two-bagger in the third, scoring two runs. Orme, center fielder for the all-professionals, made a beautiful running catch in the fourth. The playing feature was a running one hand catch by Reb Russell Indianapolis right fielder, in the seventh.

Cavet and Russell each registered two-baggers in the latter part of the game. The A. B. C.'s scored two runs in the ninth, almost tying the score. A long three bagger was knocked by Day, of the colored team. The A. B.

C.'s got nine hits off Cavet, but good fielding of Hendrick's men helped out in the pinches.
