The first game Sunday will start at 2 o'clock.

It is expected that McClure, of the A.'s, will take the mound against the New Yorkers in the opener, while opposing him will be Cannon Ball Redding, said to be the greatest colored twirler in the game. Stringbean Williams, who is well known here, having starred as a member of the local team, is expected to work the second scrap for the Bacharach Giants. Jeffries or the local Williams may start for the A. B. C's.

The largest crowd of the season is expected to see the games. A number of delegations from Anderson, Muncie, Kokomo and other nearby towns have purchased tickets in advance. These two clubs play at Muncie Saturday.

## GIANTS MEET A. B. C.'S HERE IN DOUBLE BILL

The famous colored aggregation from the east will clash with Taylor's team in a double bill at Washington park, the first game starting at 2 o'clock. The Bacharach club is composed of some of the best negro ball tossers in the game and a big crowd is expected to see the two clubs in action.

Dick Redding, known as Cannon Ball, is scheduled to work the first game on the mound for the visitors Sunday and opposing him will be McClure. Stringbean Williams, former star A. B. C. pitcher, is with the Giants and is expected to twirl the second scrap. These two teams play single games Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.
