

Tesreau's Trim Cubans In 10-Inning Battle

New York, Aug. 27.—Sunday, before a crowd of 5,000 fans, Tesreau's Bears and the Cuban Stars split even in a twin bill, the Cubans taking the opener after a ninth-inning rally 2 to 1, and Jeff the dinner engagement 1 to 0 in ten innings. Lucas, who pitched the first game, held the home boys to 3 scattered hits. Godfrey pitched splendid ball until the ninth, when two singles, an error and Lucas' sacrifice fly was his undoing.

The second game was a pitchers' battle between Jeff and Fabra, the former allowing two bingles and the latter three. Both teams were scoreless until the tenth, when Simpson hit a clean home run over the center field fence. Jeff struck out 12 batsmen. The score:
