

### JOLT FOR SCOTT PERRY

Allentown, Pa., Sept. 26.—Dorney's Park was packed this afternoon to see Scott Perry of Connie Mack's Athletics pitch for Maury's Professionals against Hilldale, and saw the big leaguer fall by the wayside before the fusillade of bingles of Bolden's men, 6 to 2. Perry received gilt-edge support, but his opponents carried too much wood, and his teammates found difficulty in getting them safe on Hector. Pooltinger, in center field, robbed Santop and Johnson of apparently home runs by sensational fielding.
