hope of seeing the famous Ruth add another to his list and they were greatly disappointed, although they applauded the work of the Hilldale pitcher in stopping the famous slugger. In his first trip to the plate he took three healthy swings at the ball and was out without even fouling off one. In his next trip to the plate he took two strikes and then lofted an easy one to Johnson in center field; then for the third trip Flournoy whiffed him again without letting him get near enough to foul one. In order to hold him hitless the Hilldale pitcher passed him in the fourth trip to the pan.
