

# A. B. C.'S RALLY TO BEAT ALL PROS

Indianapolis, Ind., Oct. 18.—A startling rally in the eighth inning yesterday gave the A. B. C.'s the decision over the All-Pros at Washington park. Some wobbly baseball on the part of the All-Pros allowed the A.'s to clog the sacks in this session without a man being retired. With one run across the pan in this round and the bases still full with one retired, Ben Taylor shot a triple to the left field fence, putting the contest in the box. Score, 6 to 4.

Until this eighth round Art Nehf was so much a master of the A.'s it

didn't seem possible they would menace the lead scored by the All-Pros in the first round at the expense of Dicta Johnson and his support.

Five of the first six men to face the Giants' lefty were strike-out victims. Nehf let up in his work and the A.'s began to drive the ball around the lot, but was able to get only three blows up to the fatal eighth.
