

# AMERICAN GIANTS WIN FROM ROGERS PARKS

Schorling's Park Sunday afternoon. —Two errors in the ninth, one by Grant, caused Tom Williams to be deprived of a shutout game and the other by Bobby Williams spoiling the chances of a possible double play, was the closing factors in a five to one victory of the American Giants over the crack Rogers Park nine. The Giant's five runs were the result of timely hitting. In the second frame Bobby Williams tripled following Gans' lease on life, when the visiting first baseman fielded his grounder and Lafferty the pitcher covering first on the run dropped the ball. Grant singled and then came Bobby with his slashing drive, scoring both. Williams immediately stole home, Erickson taking a pitchout and the two went together at the plate. Williams over slid the rubber, but scrambled back in time to tag it when the impact caused the catcher to drop the pjl. Des Moss singled in the third, being the first man up and went all the way to second when Welsner threw over Atreau's head. Torrenti took a healthy swing and then sent one to the fence be-

tween center and right for a circuit drive, sending De Moss in ahead of him. That was all for the Giants. The visitors never had a chance only in the ninth. Williams (Tom), pitched a steady, heady game, striking out eleven men and his ability to catch men off the sacks made the visitors cautious. Errors put Lafferty in the hole several times.

The absence of Rube Foster made little difference with the game. The big fellow was in Detroit on business. The team hits the road late Thursday night opening up in the city of the straits on Saturday. The crowd while fairly good was kept down on account of the early morning showers and the threatening clouds. The score:
