

WHITWORTH STOPS CUBAN STARS, HILLDALE WINS OUT

Whitworth pulled the game out of the fire for Manager Ed. Bolden yesterday afternoon, at the Ninth and Cedar avenue grounds, when he was sent in to relieve Cockerell in the third frame against the Cuban Stars of Havana. The Islanders had found Cockerell's slants to their liking and successfully met his onslaught in the second frame, registering three bullseyes and were on a fair way to repeat the performance in the third frame, when the shift was made by Bolden, as two counters had crossed in that inning and a runner was at the third station with only one out.

Whitworth was equal to the occasion, however, and not only stopped the scoring of the visitors for that frame, but silenced them, as far as counting was concerned, for the rest of the battle, allowing four scattered hits for the seven innings he worked and turned the battle 7 to 5.
