

BLACK SOX FACES ACID TEST SUNDAY

**Will Meet Baltimore Yanigans in a
Double-headed at Oriole
Park.**

The Black Sox, colored champions of Maryland, who haven't lost a series to a local club in two years, will be put to the acid test next Sunday when they tackle the Baltimore Yanigans in a double-header at Oriole Park. Ed Rommell, of the Philadelphia Club, of the American League, will hurl against the Sox. Two years ago, Ed, hurling for the Walbrook All Stars, beat the Black Sox at Westport in a thrilling game, 3 to 1. Harry Frank, of the Orioles, hurled the second game for Walbrook and was beaten by the colored champions, 5 to 4. Seven of the nine regulars of the Black Sox have batted over .300 this year and Rommell will have

his work cut out for him to stop the
slugging crew from Westport.

ROMMELL IN BOX AGAINST BLACK SOX

With Ed Rommell, of the Philadelphia American League Club on the rubber, the Baltimore Yanigans will tackle the Black Sox, colored champions of Maryland, Virginia and District of Columbia, in a double-header next Sunday afternoon at Oriole Park.
