Lincoln Giants Will Be Here
For Friday and Saturday
Games; Cobb for Sunday.

According to present plans the San Diegans and the Lincoln Giants will cross bats in the stadium Friday and Saturday, while Cobb will be here Sunday to play centerfielder for San Diego in the contest with Vernon. Although it has not been definitely settled, there is a possibility that San Diego and the Lincoln Giants will engage in a three-game series. It is definitely settled that there will be the games of Friday and Saturday afternoons and whether the series will be made three games and be begun Thursday afternoon has not been announced as yet.

The Lincoln Giants are declared to be a whizz of a ball team. Hubbard, star pitcher for the colored aggregation, is reputed to have a world of stuff and in a recent Los Angeles game he had the Vernon Tigers at his mercy. Poies, an outfielder with the Giants, has for several years been known as the colored Cobb of baseball. He is the club's lead-off man and is said to be a speedy fellow on the paths. Another star with the dusky outfit is Pettus, who plays first. He has played ball here before, being a

member of Rube Foster's club which tangled on many occasions in the old games at Athletic park when San Diego boasted of the strongest ball club ever organized for regular winter pastiming.
