

# Colored Giants Coming to Play Here Thursday

The Alexander Giants, colored champs of the west, come to town non Armistice day to battle Tom Downey's San Diegans at the stadium.

The cream of the Darktown tribes, raked in from Kansas City, St. Louis, Chicago, Salt Lake, Los Angeles and points west, are touring under the technical name of Alexander's Giants. They made Vernon extend themselves to the limit to win over them a week ago Sunday in Los Angeles and are press-agented as some fast pumpkins with the baseball. They come here Thursday for a single battle, after which the San Diego team will pack up and go to Los Angeles to play the same team two games up there, one on Saturday, the other Sunday.

There are two luminant colored clubs in southern California this winter—the Alexander Giants and the New York Lincoln Giants. The last named club, boasting 16 ball tossers, arrived in Los Angeles last Thursday. They came all the way from New York to spend the winter on the coast. Only recently they battled the Chicago American

Giants for the colored championship of the world, and lost after a bitter

fight through two series.

These teams, made up of colored stars who could be in the big show but for their ebony skin, can be depended upon to make a great hit with San Diego audiences. San Diegans will recall the two visits of Rube Foster and his Chicago gang. Both Alexanders and the Lincoln Giants are ranked as better ball clubs than the clubs Foster brought west.
