

# DOWNNEY'S OUTFIT LOSES TWO GAMES

Lincoln Giants, Crack Colored  
Team, Beats Locals in  
North; Will Play Here.

"They hung crape on us twice,  
and, believe me, they have some ball  
team."

This is the word which Capt. Tom  
Downey of the San Diego diamond  
artists sent here yesterday from Los  
Angeles, where his club was defeated  
6 to 1 Saturday and 3 to 0 yesterday  
by the Lincoln Giants, declared to  
be the fastest team of colored pro-  
fessionals ever playing in the west.

The Lincoln Giants will be here for a return engagement with the locals in Friday and Saturday games at the stadium, these games being a part of the week-end baseball program which will be climaxed next Sunday when Ty Cobb plays center field for San Diego in a game with the Vernon champions.

"The Lincoln Giants will show the fans some baseball and my team must be at its best to hold them," was Downey's declaration.

In the Saturday game the Giants beat "Lefty" Thomas. Yesterday they were out-hit in the ratio of 2 to 1 by the San Diegans, but the Giants made three runs on their four hits and San Diego went scoreless on its eight. Hill pitched for Downey's club yesterday. Hubbard, recognized as one of the foremost colored pitchers of the United States, was on the slab for the Lincoln Giants. The Saturday and Sunday games in Los Angeles drew big crowds.
