Kitchener, Ont., May 8.—Andy Kille, the former Canadian leaguer, made the first hit off Lefty Donaldson's delivery in the ninth inning in the exhibition game here Wednesday afternoon between the Detroit Stars and the Kitchener Beavers, and scored on a close
