KLEIN TOSSERS DROP MATCH TO COLORED SQUAD

Bacharach Giants Nose Out
Powerful Elizabethtown Nine,

vere jolt yesterday afternoon, when the Bacharach Giants, of Atlantic City, champion colored team of the country, defeated them on Island Park in a fast ball game, score 2 to 1. The candy makers will attempt to even things this afternoon when the two nines clash again on the Elizabethtown diamond.

Walter Harned worked on the Klein slab yesterday and there appeared to be something wrong with him. He was found for seven safe hits. However, he might have won the game had it not been for several costly errors made by his team mates.

Neither team scored until the third inning when the colored players got their first tally. Lloyd walked and went from first to home on a screaming two-bagger by Taylor. Bacharach got her other run in the next frame, when Poles got on base through an error by Cranston, reached second and third and crossed the plate and scored on a passed ball, Trout throwing wild to second in order to catch a runner advancing from first.

Klein made her solitary score of the contest in the sixth inning. Trout walked, was sacrificed to second by Harned, went to third on a passed ball and scored on Hunte's hit.

The losers were able to connect safely with the ball but four times, and of those hits "Dick" Kauffman

made two. Reading, the Bacharach moundsman, pitched a remarkable game.

At one period of the game, Pugh, the colored nine's right fielder robbed Klein of a run when he made a beautiful nab of a crack that was labeled for four bases.
