

BACHARACH GIANTS WON THREE STRAIGHT

**Came From Behind and Took
Saturday's Contest.**

TWO HOME RUNS HIT

**Millville Fell On Roberts in First
Two Rounds and Got Five
Runs.**

The Bacharach Giants made it three in a row by copping Saturday's game from the locals by the score of 6 to 5. It was a tough one to lose, the home club having obtained five runs in the first two innings. Consistent swatting in the fourth and sixth gave the Atlantic City crowd their six runs and the game.

A decision at first base by Umpire Adams in the sixth made it possible for the Giants to tally the three runs. Brown hit back of first base to Cashman and he raced with Brown to the sack. Both men slid into the base and to all appearances Cashman was there first. Adams called Brown safe. It would have retired the side without a score.

Heavy Hitting.

Heavy clubbing by both teams made the contest interesting. Seiferman and Handy hit homers and two-base wallops were credited to Hopkins, Cashman, Taylor and Hutchinson. Taylor smashed a long fly against the right field fence in the eighth, but was held to first base.

The Richarach Giants obtained a

dozen hits off Ogden and eight of them were obtained in the fourth and sixth innings. They got to him in those stanzas and were unusually active.

Millville started in on Roberts, one of the Giants' best bets in the pitching line, and garnered one run in the first and four more in the second, but that was the end. Several opportunities were killed by double plays or else the hitter failed to produce in a pinch.

The Scoring.

In the first, Seiferman was safe on first when his bunt was played to second, retiring Robinson. Nelson walked. Lloyd's error gave Cashman a life and allowed Seiferman to count.

In the second, Steele reached first when his bunt was played to second forcing Peterson. Hopkins cracked out a two-base hit to left. Ogden flied out to Hutchinson. Robinson singled,

scoring Steele and Hopkins. Seifer-
man hit a home run over Poles' head,
chasing Robinson over ahead of him.
Nelson popped out to Taylor.

In the third with one down Handy
hit a home run over Nelson's head.
Ogden tossed out Lloyd. Taylor hit a
two-bagger. Hutchinson hit a two-bag-
ger, scoring Taylor. Brown singled,
scoring Hutchinson. Gatewood fanned.

Lloyd singled in the sixth. Taylor
forced Lloyd, Seiferman to Peterson.
Helfrich tossed out Hutchinson. Brown
hit back of first and Cashman appar-
ently beat him to the base, but Umpire
Adams said "safe." Gatewood singled
scoring Taylor and Brown. Roberts
singled, scoring Gatewood. Poles flied
out to Hopkins. The score:
