

BACHARACH GIANTS BEAT VINELAND

Vineland Staged Rally in Ninth, But Redding Put an End To It.

The Bacharach Giants defeated Vineland last evening 8 to 6. "Rube" Chambers pitched for Vineland and up until the seventh inning the game was a nip and tuck affair with the score tied up at 2 runs each. In the seventh the Atlantic City crowd got to "Rube" for several safe swats, with the result that they piled up half a dozen tallies.

A three-base knock by Hutchinson helped in Chambers' downfall Rabeinger played the ball badly. He raced in on the drive and it bounded over his head. A couple of errors by Lai and a horrible heave over Cashman's head by Yost were material aids in

the scoring.

Vineland kept fighting and on hits by Lai and Spaulding pushed a couple of tallies over on their own account in their half.

Vineland staged an exciting rally in the ninth which brought Redding from the bench. After Vineland had counted twice in the ninth with one down, Jeffries was yanked and Redding substituted without warming up. Vineland put Yim in to bat for Chambers and he walked. Rabeinger also walked and the bases were loaded. Redding was in a bad hole and Vineland fans were wild with joy. Yost popped to Haudy and McInnis hit to Hutchinson, who tagged third and the excitement was over.
