

## "Danger" Talbot Benefit.

On Sunday, Mr. Foster stated that he collected personally for Mr. Talbot, who is seriously ill with consumption, \$190, and that Mr. Charles Coniskey and Manager Callaban gave \$25 apiece; Col. B. F. Moseley, \$5; Inter City Association, ball players and fans contributed, Mr. Schorling donated the park free, ball players gave their services free and the ushers gave their time gratis. Manager Foster, upon his return from California found "Danger" Talbot in a bad physical condition, and although not a member of the club, decided to lay aside his business and personally solicit for the sick ball player. Talbot, who had been instrumental in putting Chicago on the map for Negro ball clubs, was a faithful player when Foster had charge of the Leland Giants. Mr. Foster says he was a great ball player and had the respect of all the players and public alike. He never was put out of a game, never late at practice, never fined or suspended during his long career as a ball player. The fans, managers and the public extend their sympathies and wish him a speedy recovery.

Through Mr. Foster, \$265 all told was turned over to Mr. Talbot.
