

AMERICAN GIANTS AND ST. LOUIS GIANTS IN FOUR-GAME SERIES.

Break Even In First Two Games—Both
Games Exciting—Chicago Used
Four Pitchers in One Inning
Sunday.

The American Giants won one of the most exciting games ever seen here, Monday from Charlie Mills' St. Louis Giants. When St. Louis went to bat in the last half of the seventh the score stood 9 to 0 against them. At this stage of the game they pulled off one of the most sensational batting rallies ever seen here, putting nine runs over the plate, tying the score, on two passes and 8 hits, one being a homer by Cobb. Foster used four pitchers in this inning. St. Louis counted two more in the eighth and looked to have the game sewed up, but the Chicagoans won out in the ninth, making three runs on a hit by Barber, a pass by Francis and a home run by Hill. This last inning was played in the dark.
