## HERE AND AT HARRISVILLE

Visitors Gave Havana Red Sox a Hard Tussle Here Saturday, But Proved Easy Picking Sunday — Local Management After Indian Team—Blacks to Take Canadian Trip.

The Havana Red Sox baseball club again defeated their old rivals, the Harrisville baseball club in games at this city and Harrisville Saturday and Sunday.

The Saturday game at Garland City Park was a close one, the local colored aggregation winning by but a one run margin. The score was 7 to 6. Pop's blacks obtained an early lead, but the Harrisville club went after

them in real earnest toward the end. The visitors scored four runs in the ninth, and had two men on when Pitcher McDonald tightened and saved the game.

Pitcher "Sug" Sweet, who has been engaged to twirl for Alexandria Bay team this season, twirled for the Harrisville club Saturday. Sweet is a former Watertown twirler. He has been pitching league ball for the past two years.

The Sunday game at Harrisville was rather one-sided, the colored men winning by a 10 to 4 score. Pitcher Ryan, of Utica, worked in the box for Harrisville, while Gray was on the knoll for the Havana Red Sox.

The local management is endeavoring to secure the Onondaga Indian baseball club for a game here next Saturday.

The colored team will take a trip into Canada for games early in July.
