

# BAY POWERLESS BEFORE RED SOX

GOUVERNEUR GAME RESULTS IN  
13 TO 4 SCORE

## WILLIAMS SHINES IN BOX

Small Crowd Sees Curtain Rung  
Down on North Country's Best  
Baseball Season—At Adams Today.

Gouverneur, Sept. 24. — Pop watkins' colored ball tossers defeated the Alexandria Bay team here yesterday afternoon by the score of 13 to 4 in a game almost entirely devoid of features. The exception, perhaps, was the pitching of Williams for the Alexandria Bay.

The attendance was by far the smallest of the season. Many thought the game was to have been played Friday afternoon. Neither team scored during the first two innings. Williams struck out men in one, two, three fashion, during both sessions.

In the third, owing to several errors by the summer resort boys, five colored men raced over the plate. In the fourth Alexandria Bay sent two men home on clean hitting. In the eighth the Red Sox added four more. Williams worked here for the first time, and his pitching was by far the best seen this season. Deal kept the colored batsmen guessing much of the time. Corcoran was behind the bat for Alexandria Bay and Dixon acted in the same capacity for the Watertown men.

Yesterday's game closes the season here and local fans are unanimous in the opinion that they have had the best exhibitions ever witnessed in this north country.
