WINTER LEAGUE FORCED TO QUIT

**San Bernardino Fails to Draw Paying
Crowds and the Manager Decides
He Cannot Stand the Expense.
Backers Have Lost Money**

SAN BERNARDINO, Nov. 22.—The Southern California Winter league disbanded here Sunday, following the withdrawal of the Gate City club. The league was composed of San Bernardino, Cline-Cline and the Chicago American Giants.

Since the local team has disbanded the league will follow suit, as it cannot run only three clubs.

One of the main reasons why the club lost money was the railroad expense. A club could not be located in Los Angeles and the local team had to stand the expense of bringing a team from San Diego almost every Sunday, which was too great.

The railroad fare from San Diego to San Bernardino is three times greater than that from Los Angeles to the Gate City, and the club could not make things pay.

The attendance at San Bernardino has been poor this winter and the club has not made expenses. The backers have lost a considerable amount of money and have refused to continue.
