

GIANTS WIN FROM CUBANS

Colored Stars Bunch Hits in 11th and Take 5-4 Game

Sharon, Conn., Sept. 1.—The Poughkeepsie Cubans and Royal Giants of Brooklyn battled in an 11-inning game here yesterday afternoon before a crowd of 400, furnishing the fans with a pretty exhibition of baseball. The Brooklyn players came out the better of the argument winning in the 11th by the score of 5-4. The contest was a pitching duel between Munoz, for the Cubans, and Harvey and Sykes for the Royal Giants. "Lefty" Harvey, sensational darkey twirler, pitched a wonderful game until the fifth when he was obliged to retire in favor of Sykes because of a sore arm.

Sykes filled the bill in a creditable manner, and his delivery was most puzzling to the heavy-hitting Cubans. Munoz pitched first-class ball for the Poughkeepsie team, but bunching of hits enabled the Royal Giants to score at the needed time.
