

RUBEN WAS THERE WITH THE WALLOP

Called From Club House Rapp
Hits Homer Which Saves
Day for Camden

Royal Giants Looked Like Winners,
But That Smash Started Batting
Rally

Summoned from the clubroom where he had gone when the game seemed hopelessly lost, Rube Rapp set 6000 fans wild by smashing out a home run and tying the score in the game between Camden City and the Brooklyn Royal Giants. Bakey followed with a double and scored a moment later when Handy dropped Kemerle's fly. It was the greatest rally ever seen in Camden. Two were down and the Giants five runs to the good. Sagel was hit, Laughlin singled, Lafferty doubled and Livingstone singled, netting three runs. Rapp was found in the altogether in the clubhouse. Pulling on his uniform he hurried to the plate, swung on the first ball pitched and sent it fifty feet over the left field fence, sending Livingstone in ahead of him. Then came the play that won the game. In the third inning Sagel hit a homer with the bases full. The final score was 17 to 16.
