BOOSTER DAY AUG. 31 WITH CUBANS AT PARK

"Booster Day," such will Monday, August 31, be known among residents generally throughout this city and vicinity and particularly among baseball fans. The Perth Amboy Board of Trade has designated August 31 as booster day and are making plans to make it the biggest day for professional baseball that this city has ever had. The attraction at the local ball park will be the Pacers against the Long Branch Cubans in the final appearance of Dr. Henriquez and his Cuban tribe here. Plans are being made by the Pacer management to carry out an attractive schedule after the closing of the league. An extraordinary roster is being prepared to run from next Sunday on. In addition to the league game Sunday, the Knights of St. Peter, of New Brunswick, will meet the St. Anthonys. The following Sunday the Saints and Franklins will battle for the city championship honors and on September 13 the Pacers will play the city champions of 1914.

Extensive preparations are being made by the Board of Trade and the management of the Perth Amboy Baseball Club to make booster day one long to be remembered among fans. It is concluded that with the present Pacer team working as it has been the past few days, the Cubans, with their somewhat crippled team,

due to the sale of players, will have to go some to win. There will be a general admission fee of fifty cents and there will be no extra charge for the grandstand.

Booster day is designed to give fans of this city and vicinity an opportunity to show their appreciation to the Pacer team for its efforts to give Perth Amboy the proper kind of baseball. It cannot be denied that they tried their utmost. The team now has a most capable manager and new players are being taken on, even at this late date. Booster days have been a success in other cities on the Atlantic circuit, and it is believed that it will score a large turnout here. About 1,000 tickets will be printed and distributed for advance sale.

Billy Tamm, a popular Newburgh player, will appear at third base for the Pacers on and after September 20. It is expected that the New York Giants will appear here September 20. A New York state pitcher will be used by the Pacers and they will try with every effort to avenge their last drubbing at the hands of the McGraw men.

It is likely that the St. Anthonys will be the whole show in their rubber game at the park on August 30. On that date the Pacers will play either in Elizabeth or Stamford, Conn. They will endeavor to use the same team that they now have against the city champions on September 13. In order to do this it may be necessary to bring some players from their home towns.
