

JERSEYS IN TWIN B. B. BILL SUNDAY

**Royal Giants, One of the Best
Colored Teams in the U. S.
A., Will Play Double-Header
With Driscoll's Stars.**

Two games for one admission fee will be the baseball lure at the Jersey City ball yard (West Side and Culver avenues) Sunday afternoon. The rejuvenated Jerseys will have as opponents in both contests the Royal Giants. The first game will be started at 2 o'clock and the second at 4 o'clock. The Royal giants are conceded to be the class of the colored teams in the metropolitan district.

In the curtain-raiser "String Bean" Williams, the sensational colored Western horseshoe heaver, will engage in a pitching duel with Ted Smith, former gunner of the Providence (International League) Club. Billy Kelliher, who handed the New York Giants a defeat tag last Sabbath afternoon, will oppose "Lefty" Harvey in the second section of the double bill.

Rivington Bisland, former Pittsburgh National Leaguer, will be substituted for Johnny Burke in the Jerseys' lineup, Burke having signed with the Mobile (Southern Association) Club to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Johnny Dodge, who was fatally injured by a pitched ball last week. Bisland will play at short, Tom Downey taking charge of the hot corner.
