

"DOC" SCANLON WITH DRISCOL

New Brunswick Has Former Brooklyn Twirler

Manager Dave Driscoll introduces a new pitcher to New Brunswick fans on Decoration Day afternoon—in Doc Scanlon. Doc was formerly one of the best pitching bets the Brooklyn National League team had. When he was transferred to Philadelphia Nationals, he balked and has been pitching independent baseball since. This season he is with the T. A. B. team of Elizabeth. Scanlon will work in the afternoon game against the Mohawk Giants, and opposed to him will be Harry Wickware, one of the greatest colored box artists at the present time. The Giants will also play the New Brunswicks Decoration Day morning.

The Lindemann-Hohmann battery which Driscoll worked here Sunday against Lancaster made an immense hit with the fans. Each time either one came to the bat they were applauded. Lindemann was touched rather hard in the third inning but twirled effectively in all other innings. He's not the pitcher he was a few years ago, however, though he still possesses great speed.

Until Sunday baseball is possible in Brooklyn, Lindemann and Hohmann will probably continue to work in this city on Sundays. The ban against Sunday baseball has temporarily broken up the Ridgewood team, with which Lindemann has been for years. After the death of Catcher Farmer, Hohmann has been Lindemann's battery mate, and neither will play on a team without the other.
