

# WICKWARE TRIMS HUCKLEBERRY BOYS 12 TO 3

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Dusky Pitcher Holds Them  
To Five Hits

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GAME WAS ONE SIDED

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Peloquin Was an Easy Mark For  
Mohawk Giants and Locals  
Were Lifeles.

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The Bennington baseball team was given the trimming of the season at Morgan park yesterday afternoon, when it was defeated by the Mohawk Giants, the colored team from Schenectady by a score of 12 to 3. The dusky sluggers pounded "Joe" Peloquin for a total of 25 bases and won in a walkaway. The ease with

which the Giants collected hits off Peloquin was enough to win several ball games but in addition the auburn-haired boxman from Willimantic was given punk support. The Huckleberry boys played like a lot of "dead ones." There were occasional bursts of real baseball by the locals but during the larger portion of the game they were so lifeless that many of the spectators left the stand.

Wickware, who is said to be the greatest boxman among the colored teams this year, pitched for the Giants and while he was not forced to work he showed that his reputation was genuine. He also proved that he was not only a twirler but a batter as well, with four clean hits out of five times at bat. There was a good Friday crowd in attendance and it is to be regretted that the home team could not have shown its appreciation with a better display of interest in its work.

There were only three innings of real baseball, the first three periods. The Giants went after Peloquin for

three singles in the opening stanza and collected two runs. Bennington came back with the same number of tallies due to Carolan's three base drive into center field. Neither team scored in the second, although both had runners on bases. In the third a hit and an error gave the Giants another run but a hit and a pair of errors put Bennington runners on second and third. Here it was that Wickware showed his ability as a pitcher. With two on bases and none out, he began to shoot the ball over the plate and quickly retired the side. From the third to the ninth the game was a procession of biff, bang as the darkies hammered the ball to all corners of the field and raced around the bases. The score.
