

END OF BASEBALL SEASON

Directors Decided to Disband Team After Game with Pittsfield.

The directors of the Bennington baseball association decided last evening to disband the team for the season. It was the original intention to play ball from the Saturday before Memorial day to Labor day, but all the other clubs which originally composed the Northern Tr. State league have gone to the wall and it has been difficult to secure either home or out of town games. Then, again, the finances were getting low and the directors believed it best to take the safe end of the situation instead of risking another week of baseball.

Like all ball teams, the Huckleberry boys of 1913 have had their days of joy and gloom. They have received, perhaps, a little more attention from the knockers than the teams of previous seasons but now that the game has been laid on the shelf for another year and the fans have a chance to think things over it will have to be conceded that Manager Morrissey has given Bennington a whole lot of good base ball. The team played 46 games and won 31, a record that is good enough for any club in the bush league country. The games have been played without discord, the management has been clean in every respect and the season has provided the people of Bennington with much enjoyment that they could not otherwise have obtained. Manager Morrissey and the directors have had their troubles but they have the satisfaction of knowing that they have pulled through a successful season in spite of difficulties.
