GAME DRAWS A GOOD CROWD.

The Rats are without doubt hard hitters but they could do nothing with the puzzlers doped out by Loudell. Both sides

did some clever field work and a number of good catches and pick-ups were pulled off. Notwithstanding the lopsided score, 12 to 1 in favor of Webster City, the game was an interesting one.
