

DETROIT STARS HERE SUNDAY

Tenny Blount's Detroit Stars will tackle the American Giants at Schorling Park and it is the first game that the formidable team from across the lake has played in Chicago this year, and it will be the last show of this team here. In order for the fans to get a good peep at P. Hill, Petway, Blount and Co., a double header will be played. Sunday the 12th is the last and only opportunity that the fans will have to witness the fast play that Lyons is putting up, also Riggins, the shining star at short, and Cooper the crack south-paw pitcher, who is said to be without a peer in the circuit. Holland, Blount's star right hander, will work one game,

and the fans will see one of, if not the very best pitcher on the new circuit.

The games at Detroit have been hotly contested and the play does not reveal any great amount of advantage of one team over the other. The Stars are in second place in the new circuit, and there is no question about them staying there, and only for a run of hard luck, in which they were forced, through injury of regulars, to use inexperienced talent, and any number of green rookie pitchers, they would now be right on the heels of the leaders, if not out in front. The battle between South-paws Dave Brown and Andrew Cooper promises to be the most stubborn fought out affair yet staged at the south side park. The two had a duel lately, but the event was not to the liking of all concerned, so the go will be staged all over again. Tom Williams is generally conceded to be the crack right hander, the ace of the circuit. His claim, or the claim of his backers, is disputed by the Detroit fans and pitcher Holland of the Stars; the game Sunday will furnish first class grounds for settling the argument. Big Bill Gatewood, Hewitt, Warfield, Wesley and other known cracks are with the team and will show here. Other clubs of the circuit, the A. B.

C.'s, will open at Muncie, Ind., on the 11th with the St. Louis Giants and will carry the battle on in to Indianapolis for Sunday and a series. The Hoosier team has just returned from the East where they won three out of five from the Bacharach Giants. The Chicago Giants go up to Fondulac, Wis. for Sunday, with games scheduled against many of the strong Chicago League teams to follow.

STARS LOSE FIRST TO GIANTS

American Giants Pound Local Hurlers, Winning 8 to 3

DETROIT, Mich., Sept. 7.—Detroit Stars dropped the first of the series to the Chicago American Giants, 8 to 3. The visitors landed on the local twirlers for 12 hits for 19 bases.

MacDonald started for the Stars, but was relieved by Cooper in the second.

Brown, for Chicago, allowed but four hits, two each to Lyons and Warfield. Demoss and Gans each had a perfect day at bat, the former getting a single, two doubles and a pair of sacrifice flies in five trips to the plate, while Gans got two singles and a pair of triples.

Torrienti and Lyons robbed each other of sure triples by sensational catches. Torrienti was also robbed of a single in the seventh by Riggan's wonderful running one-hand catch.

DAYTON MARCOS EASY FOR CUBANS

The Cuban stars defeated the Dayton Marcos at Schorling's Park, Sunday, to the tune of 7 to 2.

The feature events of the game was a great stop made by Rios in the fourth inning, robbing Taylor of a hit and keeping the Marcos from tying the score. Pedroso also made a magnificent catch of Rios' high throw to first and a fast double play when Murray caught a bunt fly and doubled Abren out at second. Le Blanc held the Marcos hitless for five inning, the first hit made by the Marcos was when Brown hit a single down the right field foul line in the sixth inning. In the last half of the sixth on loose fielding by the Marcos, three hits and a perfect squeeze by Abren, the Cuban, made six runs.

The Marcos scored their two and only runs of the game in the eighth inning when Murray reached first on Pedroso's error, then stole second. Branham, next man up, was out on a fly to second, Larre hit to Le Blanc who threw to third to stop Murray but Herrera muffed the ball, causing Murray to score and Larre to reach second. Brown went out second to

first. Larre scored on Wingfield's two-bagger. Taylor fanned, ending the inning and the Marcos chance of winning the game.
