

# ATLANTICS GET ANOTHER GAME

Beat Out Philadelphia Giants  
in Fast Game, 10  
to 3

In their first of a series of two games with the Philadelphia Giants, the Wilmington Atlantics won easily yesterday by a 10 to 3 score. The visitors outbatted the local team but "took the balloon" at critical points. All in all it was a good game.

Wilmington continued to play in good form. Yerkes started to do the pitching but was relieved by Nichols after the visitors had scored two runs on clean hitting off him. The colored men

touched Nichols hard, too, but clean fielding on the part of the locals kept down the runs. The Giants went to the bad in the sixth and again in the seventh inning.

Neither side scored in the first inning. The visitors batted out two runs in rapid succession in the second inning and the locals did not tie it up until the third. Then Nichols slammed out a two-bagger and was followed by Watson, who reached first safely, Nichols going all the way round to second on a single by Watson. O'Neil followed with a two-bagger and the first two men on bases scored, tying the score. In the second half of the sixth Wilmington got four more, in the seventh they got one and in the eighth ran in three. The Giants scored their third run in the sixth. Swiggett, for the Giants, kept the boys guessing for the first five innings.
