

Faribault Flecks Defeat Gophers

Game Abounds in Long Dis- tance Clouting—McCleary Pitches Today.

FARIBAU, Minn., May 31.—(Special.)—In a game characterized by the unusual number of extra base clouts made on each side, the Faribault Flecks beat the Gophers by a score of 9 to 8 at Faribault yesterday.

The Gophers got away to a two-run lead in the first inning and for three innings held the Flecks runless. In the fourth inning, however, the Flecks got busy and two singles, a double and a home run drive by Kehoe made a total of four runs. The Gophers tied it up in their half of the fifth, and from then on it was a see-saw, first one team and then the other taking the lead.

In the Flecks' last turn at bat in the ninth, and the score in a knot, Kehoe,

first up, singled, Mabling doubled to right field and Malloy singled, scoring Kehoe and ending the game.

Both pitchers twirled good ball, but Lamb was steadier in the pinches. Pate was hit hard in the fourth and eighth innings, and fast fielding behind him kept the score down. Mabling was chief stickler, getting two doubles and a triple in four trips to the plate.

Bernstein played a great game at third base, accepting six chances cleanly.

The two clubs play again today. McCleary will pitch for Faribault and Lundin for the Colored Gophers. The score:
