

# Gophers Leave Field With Score Tied

## McCleary Batted Freely, but Is Saved by Fleck's Support.

FARIBAULT, Minn., June 1.—(Special.)—With the score tied in the eighth inning of the game between the Faribault Flecks and the St. Paul colored Gophers, McDugal, the Gopher shortstop, doubled into the buggies in left field. The ball struck a buggy top and bounded over the fence. The Gophers claimed a home run, in the face of ground rules, which only allowed two bases on a hit into the crowd and when refused by Umpire McCarthy left the field. The game was forfeited to Faribault, 2 to 0.

McCleary, on the mound for Faribault, was batted freely, and only great support of his fielders kept the score down. On the other hand, London pitched great ball, allowing only three hits, but the Flecks bunched these in one inning and netted three runs and a tie score. McDugal was the heavy hitter of the day, with a perfect batting percentage.
