

INDIANAPOLIS IS BEST NEGRO NINE EVER HERE

The Caulfield Ads, have one more chance to win a game from the negro team of Indianapolis. The last game of the series was scheduled for Monday afternoon and Fred Caulfield planned a shift in his lineup from which he expected better results than were obtained Saturday and Sunday.

The Indianapolis is decidedly the best negro squad that has ever been seen in action here. There are at least four ball players on the team who would class with any negro players in the business. The two real stars of the club are First Baseman Taylor and Outfielder Charleston. The shortstop, Ciska, plays the game with classes and makes every hop of the ball look dead easy.

The Caulfields Sunday were faced first by a chocolate colored Carl Mave, named Diamukos, a southern negro. Diamukos fired the ball with an underhand swing and he

kept the ball running throughout the innings. He was relieved by a man named Pilo, who was just as effective although the Ads got to him for one run in the ninth.

The Ads did not play the game they were capable of. The team stacks up better with Lewis behind the bat, Wilson on first and Welch in the sun garden. Homer pitched good ball, but his support was poor.

A large crowd saw Sunday's game, numbering more than 1000.
