

# GIANTS TROUNCED

Dayton, Ohio, June 18.—The holding of Britt and the fielding and basing of "Koke" Alexander featured the 7 to 0 win of the Marcos over the Chicago Giants at Westwood field Sunday afternoon. Britt allowed the visitors but three hits, one of which came in the ninth inning.

A running catch by Alexander with his back turned to the ball and his home run over the right field fence in the fourth frame were the best hits of the game.

Ball hurled for the Giants, and although he held the Marco sluggers to ten hits, his three bases on balls and three hit batsmen proved his undoing. Britt was master of the situation all the way and was near in

danger of being scored on. Not a Chicago man reached third base.

A crowd of about 4,000 fans witnessed the game. When Alexander hit the ball over the fence for a homer, the crowd showered him with money. He got three hits out of three trips to the plate and was hit by a pitched ball on another occasion.
