

CARDINALS LOSE TO GIANTS, 5 TO 4

St. Louis, Oct. 15.—In the opening game of the series between the Cardinal barnstormers and the St. Louis Giants, the latter team was the victor in ten innings, 5 to 4. The winning run was scored when Clemons dropped a throw to the home plate. Jim Lyons opened the inning with a single and took second on a wild pitch. Hewett bunted safely when A. Lyons fumbled. Charleston ~~Lavan~~ was purposely passed to fill up the bases. Blackwell hit to A. Lyons and the latter threw home, but Clemons dropped the ball and J. Lyons scored, ending the game.

The Giants got away to a lead of four runs in the first two innings. Charleston drove out a home run in the first session. In the second slow fielding, errors and hitting mixed in netted the Giants 3 runs. In the fifth the Cardinals got one of the runs back on some hitting and a couple of force-outs. In the sixth they got after Drake and drove him off the slab.
