

ROYAL GIANTS TO MEET GLOBE NINE

Famous Colored Ball Club Will Endeavor to Take Third Straight From Locals

The Brooklyn Royal Giants, billed as the greatest aggregation of negro ball tossers in the United States, will endeavor to make it three straight over Tommy O'Hara's Globe Tire team tomorrow afternoon at Globe field, Prospect Street. The Giants twice defeated the Globe crew last year, but O'Hara feels confident of turning the tables in the third meeting.

The Royal Giants will use either Stringbean Williams or Southpaw Harvey in the box, with all their regulars in their respective positions. Fritz Gaiser attempted to stop the Giants in both conflicts, so it is more than likely Boice will be sent against the colored visitors.

Boice has won six straight games for the Globe team, pitching wonderful ball in his last three starts. Only eleven hits have been made off his delivery in the last 27 innings, while five men have crossed the plate in

the six games he has worked. He also has a record of 17 consecutive innings pitched in the last two games without being scored on, and followers of the team are pulling hard for him to beat Jaynes' record of last season, when he pitched 21 innings without allowing a man to score.
