SEND SEVEN RUNS ACROSS IN
SECOND INNING—SCORE
8 TO 2.

Gouverneur, Aug. 14.—The Havana
Red Sox defeated the Adams baseball
team here yesterday afternoon in a

rather one-sided contest by the score of 8 to 2. In the first inning the colored men sent a man over the home plate, and in the second they scored seven men in rapid succession, when the Adams men went to pieces temporarily. The attendance was estimated at over 1,000. There were 125 automobiles parked on the grounds. In the fourth inning Adams scored their two runs, and thereafter neither team showed fast work. Feeley was in the box for Adams, and while at times he was wild on the whole, he did fairly good work. Chapman was behind the bat for Adams, and his work was good. The Red Sox battery was composed of McDonald and Dixon. The former was exceedingly wild. He hit several batsmen, and he also gave several bases on balls. The field work of both teams was good.
