

RED SOX DEFEAT BAY TEAM

Colored Men Win 13 to 4 Victory
Here Thursday Afternoon in Last
Game of the Season For Gouverneur

Last Thursday afternoon a small crowd saw the Havana Red Sox trim the Alexandria Bay baseball team here by the score of 13 to 4 in a contest that was clean and well played but devoid of any special features. The attendance was unusually small when the game opened at 2 o'clock but a half hour later enough had struggled in to make a fairly good attendance. The game was clean throughout there being no wrangling nor hard feelings and it was run off in exceptionally quick time as a result. The colored men had a new twirler for this section, Williams of the Lincoln Giants, New York city, and he proved to be the most effective artist that has been seen here this season. He was not obliged to extend himself Thursday but it was seen that he could throw almost equal to a cannon. Deal pitched a good clean game for Alexandria Bay but he did not have the terrific speed displayed by the giant colored twirler. In the third five of Pop Watkins' men crossed the home

plate owing to errors made in the field by the Bay boys and this practically assured the victory for the Red Sox as their opponents did not score until the fourth when two runs were recorded. Dixon was behind the bat for the Red Sox and Corcoran was the Alexandria Bay backstop. Williams gave 3 bases on balls and Deal gave an equal number. Deal struck out 5 and Williams struck out 9.
