

TWO BEST NEGRO TEAMS PLAY HERE NEXT WEEK

Everything is all set for the championship series of baseball which will be played at Bosse field June 21, 22 and 23, between the famous Cuban Stars of Havana, Cuba, and C. I. Taylor's A. B. C.'s of Indianapolis, the 1916 negro champions of the United States. Last year the A. B. C.'s played 138 games, won 96 lost 38, tied 4. They played Rube Foster's American Giants a series of ten games for the championship of America, won 5, lost 4 and tied 1.

As three games of the nine games to be played are to be staged at Bosse field, both clubs will fight to win, so as to have the lead on the series when they open in Indianapolis, June 24. The fans of Evansville, through the efforts of the Cherry street branch "Y," will have an opportunity of seeing the two greatest colored ball clubs in the world in action. There will positively be no hippodroming. Both clubs will play to win.
