

Pitcher Harmon, of the St. Louis Nationals, made things easy for his playmates in a recent exhibition game in Kansas City. Opposing a negro team known as the Kansas City giants, he struck out twenty-five men, which tops the usually accepted world's record of nineteen, held by Charley Shields, formerly of Seattle, and Sweeney, the old Providence pitcher, Johnny Kiing and Zack Wheat, of Brooklyn, were on the team for which Harmon pitched. The game was called at the end of the ninth, with the score 1-1. A wild throw was responsible for the one run scored off Harmon. Ramsey, who was a famous left-hander of the 80's, struck out seventeen in one game, when four strikes were allowed. It is also claimed that Ramsey struck out nineteen in one game. He had a wonderful drop ball.
